### To Whom It May Concern:

We are pleased to announce that the Municipality of Bahía Blanca city in Argentina adopted the Open Data Charter on 26th September, 2017.

The Municipality, through its Modernization and Open Government Secretary has met all the stipulated adoption criteria and provided a high-level public adoption statement that provides detailed information on the key elements of the Charter adoption criteria:

1. **Appointment of a key ministry, department, or agency, including a direct individual,**
2. **Delivery mechanism(s)** through which the Open Data Charter will be operationalized
3. **Time-bound actions** that outline specific, realistic deadlines by which progress toward implementation can be demonstrated.
4. **Means of verification** of the specific actions that will be used to track the progress of the Charter's implementation.

We are excited to have Bahía Blanca city as part of the Open Data Charter's network of 100+ governments and expert organisations worldwide that are working to open up data in ways that deliver results for citizens.
